



# CAPE LIGHT COMPACT NEW STREETLIGHT TESTING IN BARNSTABLE VILLAGE



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Barnstable Fire District has been offered an opportunity to reduce its street lighting costs by roughly 1/3 (from \$12,000 to \$8,000). This opportunity has been presented by our electrical supplier Republic Electric through Cape Light Compact. In order to realize these savings, all 136 street lights that the District now owns would require changing from our existing sodium vapor lighting to new energy efficient LED lights.

In order to give district residents a chance to see what the new lights look like, eight of them have been installed on a test basis in the County parking area so that they can be viewed by district residents. Soon another demonstration area will be established involving eight existing lights that will be replaced with the new fixtures. This test area will commence at the Rte. 6A/Hyannis Road intersection and will end at the Water Department office on Phinney's Lane.

We want your feedback to determine if this change will be of benefit to the Fire District. There is a difference in the appearance of the light that the two options provide so please take the time to view the new streetlights in either of the two test areas and contact the Prudential Committee via any of the means below to let us know your feelings on these new lights. We will keep you updated on the progress of this project and will solicit more formal feedback from residents before making any decision to move forward.
