What is the overall <u>deductible</u> ?	<b>\$300</b> member / <b>\$600</b> two-person / <b>\$900</b> family.	Generally, you must pay all of the costs from <u>providers</u> up to the <u>deductible</u> amount before this <u>plan</u> begins to pay. If you have other family members on the <u>plan</u> , each family member must meet their own individual <u>deductible</u> until the total amount of <u>deductible</u> expenses paid by all family members meets the overall family <u>deductible</u> .				
Are there services covered before you meet your <u>deductible</u> ?	Yes. Preventive care, prenatal care, prescription drugs, most office visits, mental health visits, and therapy visits. Your Grievance and Appeals Rights: There are agencies that can help if you have a complaint against your <u>plan</u> for a denial of a <u>claim</u>. ### Does this plan provide Minimum Essential Coverage? [Yes]

If you don't have <u>Minimum Essential Coverage</u> for a month, you'll have to make a payment when you file your tax return unless you qualify for an exemption from the requirement that you have health coverage for that month.

### Does this plan meet the Minimum Value Standards? [Yes]

If your plan doesn't meet the Minimum Value Standards, you may be eligible for a premium tax credit to help you pay for a plan through the Marketplace.
